CURRENT LAW

Under current law, generally, no person may operate any motor vehicle on a highway if the vehicle displays any color of light other than white or amber to the front, or any color other than red to the rear.

2015 ASSEMBLY BILL 100

2015 Assembly Bill 100 allows a motorcycle to be equipped with a lighting device that illuminates the ground directly beneath the motorcycle, if the lighting device is not visible to approaching vehicles; does not display a red, blue, or green light; and does not display a flashing light.

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1

Assembly Amendment 1 to 2015 Assembly Bill 100 removes the bill's prohibition against green lights, and it adds amber light to the list of colors of light that are prohibited. Additionally, it prohibits the lighting device from displaying lights that oscillate or rotate.

BILL HISTORY

Assembly Amendment 1 to Assembly Bill 100 was offered by Representative Jagler on April 7, 2015. On April 7, 2015, the Assembly Committee on Transportation voted to recommend adoption of the amendment, on a vote of Ayes, 14; Noes, 0; and Absent, 1. On the same day, the committee voted to recommend passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 15; Noes, 0.
