2015 Assembly Bill 16

2015 Assembly Bill 16 requires the Department of Justice (DOJ) to design a poster that provides information regarding the National Human Trafficking Resource Center Hotline. Under the bill, DOJ must make the poster available to print from its Internet site and must encourage that the poster be displayed at certain locations.

Assembly Substitute Amendment 1

Assembly Substitute Amendment 1 requires the DOJ to design a poster, or obtain a predesigned poster, that provides information regarding a human trafficking resource center hotline. The poster must inform individuals what human trafficking is and provide a phone number that a victim or someone who knows a victim can call or text for help and services. The substitute amendment requires the DOJ to make the poster available to print from its Internet site and encourage that the poster be displayed at the following locations:

- Gas stations with signs visible from an interstate or state highway that offer amenities to commercial vehicles.
- Hotels.
- Adult entertainment establishments.
- Salons at which hair or nail services are provided.
- Places at which employers engage some employees to perform agricultural labor.
- Hospitals or other medical centers.

- Places at which athletic or sporting events occur.
- Establishments that operate as a massage parlor or spa, alternative health clinic, or similar entity.
- Expositions conducted by a county or agricultural society.
- Courthouses.
- Rest areas maintained by the Department of Transportation.
- Public and private transit stations.

Bill History

Representative Loudenbeck introduced Assembly Substitute Amendment 1 on February 12, 2015. On the same day, the Assembly voted to adopt the substitute amendment and pass the bill, as amended, on a voice vote.
