Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate					
The proposed rules implement the licensing of elevator contractors and installers as mandated by 2005 Wisconsin Act 456. Under the Act, no person may engage in the business of installing or servicing conveyances or working on a conveyance unless licensed as of June 1, 2007. The proposed permanent rules would replace the emergency rule issued on June 1, 2007. The department estimates that there are approximately 40 elevator contractors, 500 elevator mechanics and 500 apprentices/helpers that would be impacted by the legislation. The Department estimates the revenues generated by charging the licensing fees for elevator contractors and installers will be approximately \$28,500 annually. The increase in workload due to the new licensing requirements will be performed with existing staff.
