# ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD REPEALING, AMENDING AND CREATING RULES

The Wisconsin Natural Resources Board proposes an order to repeal NR 16.45(2)(b)2; to amend NR 10.01(3)(c)2, (ed)1.b. and (4)(dm)1., 10.106(2)(e), 10.13(1)(b)15, 10.275(1)(b)1, (2)(b)1. and 2., 12.10(3)(intro.), 16.45(2)(a)1., (b)1. and 2., (5)(a)(intro) and, (c)4. and (6)(h); and to create NR 10.001(8e), relating to hunting, nuisance wild animal removal and captive wildlife.

## Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

**Statutory Authority and Explanation:** Statutes that authorize the promulgation of this rule order include sections 29.014 and 227.11, Stats. These sections grant rule making authority to the department to establish and maintain open and closed seasons for hunting and that all rules promulgated under this authority are subject to review under ch. 227, Stats.

**Statutes Interpreted and Explanation:** In promulgating this rule, section 29.014, Stats., has been interpreted as providing the department with the authority to make these housekeeping clarifications.

# Related Statute or Rule: None.

**Plain Language Rule Analysis:** These hunting and trapping-related rule changes are minor and noncontroversial in nature. The intent of these rule changes is to provide clarification to existing rules, simplify regulations, and update administrative code language and references. Specifically, these rules will; correct management unit boundaries, relax bear carcass registration requirements, clarify nuisance animal removal requirements, clarify what is meant by the term "disabled hunter" for the purposes of assisting a bear hunter, correct cross-references and drafting errors, and update cross references and terminology so that NR 16 is current and compatible with ATCP 10.

**Federal Regulatory Analysis:** These state rules and statutes do not relieve individuals from the restrictions, requirements and conditions of federal statutes and regulations. Regulating the hunting and trapping of native species has been delegated to state fish and wildlife agencies. Additionally, none of the proposed rules exceed the authorities granted to states in 50 CFR 10.

**State Regulatory Analysis:** These housekeeping rule changes do not represent policy or significant rule changes that may differ from surrounding states. All surrounding states have regulations and rules in place for the management of upland, migratory and furbearing species, however, these proposed rule changes to the Wisconsin Administrative code are not relevant to or comparable to any known similar housekeeping initiatives in surrounding states.

**Summary of Factual Data and Analytical Methodologies:** This rule order is based solely on the need to correct inconsistencies created through the promulgation of other rules and statutes and to serve as a vehicle to provide clarification to existing code.

Anticipated Private Sector Costs: These rules, and the legislation which grants the department rule making authority, do not have a significant fiscal effect on the private sector. Additionally, no significant costs are associated with compliance to these rules.

**Effects on Small Business:** These rules are applicable to individual sportspersons and impose no compliance or reporting requirements for small businesses, and no design or operational standards are contained in the rule.

NR 10.001(8e) "Disabled person" for the purposes of s. 29.184(5)(b), Stats., means a person who holds a current Class A, B or C permit.

#### Section 3. NR 10.01(3)(ed)1.b. is amended to read:

NR 10.01(3)(ed)1.b. If after 2 consecutive years, as described in subd. 1. a . or par. (ez) 1. a. and am., the department determines a third season, as described under subd. 1. a., is unlikely to reduce the deer population to within 20% of the overwinter population goal established in s. NR 10.104 for the same deer management unit or units in the subsequent year, hunters shall harvest or tag an antierless deer in that unit or units with either a bow or a gun during any deer season or with an agricultural shooting permit, before they may tag a buck with either weapon in that unit or units. One antierless deer is required to authorize harvest of one buck in that unit or units, or in state parks with gun deer seasons that are within or adjoining these units, for each archery and gun deer license. Deer harvested as described in this paragraph shall be transported in accordance with s. NR 10.105 (3) (2).

#### Section 4. NR 10.01(4)(dm)1. is amended to read:

#### Section 5. NR 10.106(2)(e) is amended to read:

NR 10.106(2)(e) *Bear license (bow and gun).* Bear shall be registered within the county in which the bear was killed or adjoining county; and within the black bear management zone or at registration

stations that are adjacent to highways forming the boundary of the zone in which it was killed no later than 5:00 p.m. of the day after it was killed.

## Section 6. NR 10.13(1)(b)15. is amended to read:

NR 10.13(1)(b)15. `Cable restraints specifications.' Set, place or operate any cable restraint except for bobcat from December 1 to December 31 and fox and coyotes from December 1 to February 15, dates inclusive, provided the cable restraint conforms to the following specifications in addition to those under subd. 13. The use of cable restraints for bobcat sunsets following the 2009 season.

## Section 7. NR 10.275(1)(b)1. is amended to read:

NR 10.275(1)(b) *Migratory game birds* 1. Migratory game bird hunting for the species specified in s. NR 10.01 (1) is allowed in Governor Dodge, and Mill Bluff state parks from November 1 through December 15 or until the seasons established in s. NR 10.01 (1) conclude, whichever occurs first.

## Section 8. NR 10.275(2)(b) 1. and 2. are amended to read:

NR 10.275(2)(b) Hunting hours. 1. The hunting hours for pursuing small game at Governor Dodge, Mill Bluff, and Mirror Lake and Newport state parks shall be the same as the hours established in s. NR 10.06 (5) except that hunting hours will close at 12:00 noon daily.

2. The hunting hours for pursuing migratory game birds at Governor Dodge, <u>and</u> Mill Bluff <del>and</del> <del>Newport</del> state parks shall be the same as the hours established in s. NR 10.06 (5) except that hunting hours shall close at 12:00 noon daily.

## Section 9. NR 12.10(3)(intro.) is amended to read:

NR 12.10(3) RULE COMPLIANCE AND PARTICIPATION BY OTHERS. (intro.) The landowner, lessee, occupant or other persons assisting in the removal of wild animals causing damage or nuisance shall comply with all hunting and trapping rules specified under ch. NR 10 or ch. 29, Stats., <u>except the open</u> and closed seasons established in ch. NR 10 or unless otherwise provided under this chapter, ch. 29, Stats., or by permit. Permittees and participants who fail to comply shall be subject to the penalty applicable to the appropriate ch. NR 10 or ch. 29, Stats., violation. Persons other than the landowner, lessee or occupant, may assist in the removal of wild animals causing damage or nuisance in accordance with this subsection.

NR 16.45(2)(a)1. The deer farm is enrolled in the chronic wasting disease herd monitoring status program established by s. ATCP 10.67 10.53.

NR 16.45(2)(b)1. The deer farm is enrolled in the chronic wasting disease herd monitoring status program established by s. ATCP 10.67 10.53.

# Section 12. NR 16.45(2)(b)2. is repealed.

## Section 13. NR 16.45(5)(a)(intro) and (b) are amended to read:

NR 16.45(5) FENCING COMPLIANCE EXTENSION. (a) *Time period to bring deer farms with perimeter fences less than 80 acres in size fences into compliance with sub. (2).* Farm-raised deer farms with white-tailed deer with perimeter fences less than 80 acres in size shall have until January 1, 2004 to enter the chronic wasting disease herd monitoring status program established by s. ATCP <u>10.67</u> <u>10.53</u> or

to file a fencing plan with the department on forms supplied by the department and until June 30, 2004 to comply with the fencing plan.

(b) *Time period to bring deer farms with perimeter fences 80 acres or greater in size fences into compliance with sub. (2).* Farm-raised deer farms with white-tailed deer with perimeter fences 80 acres or greater in size shall have until January 1, 2004 to enter the chronic wasting disease monitoring <u>herd</u> <u>status</u> program established by s. ATCP <u>10.67</u> <u>10.53</u>, <u>herd surveillance program established by ch. ATCP</u> <del>10, or to enter the file a</del> deer harvest plan established in sub. (2) (b) 3. <u>with the department</u>, or file a fencing plan with the department on forms supplied by the department and until December 31, 2004 to comply with the fencing plan.

## Section 15. NR 16.45(6)(h) is amended to read:

NR 16.45(6)(h) Status of enrollment in chronic wasting disease herd monitoring status program as established by s. ATCP 10.67, 10.53 surveillance program as established by ch. ATCP 10 or a deer harvest plan established in sub. (2) (b) 3.

Section 16. Effective dates. These rules shall take effect on upon publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register as provided in s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.

**Section 17. Board adoption.** This rule was approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources board on August 15, 2007 and December 5, 2007.
