## ORDER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION ADOPTING RULES SEP 2 1 SEP 2 1 SEP 3 1

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State Superintendent of Public Instruction by Sections 227.023(1) and 115.28(7), Wisconsin Statutes, the State of Wisconsin, Department of Public Instruction, hereby adopts rules as follows:

That PI 3.03(16) is renumbered to PI 3.03(16)(b).

That PI 3.03(16)(a) is created as follows:

PI 3.03(16) Substitute Teachers. (a) Short-term substitutes are defined as teachers employed for less than 20 consecutive days in the same teaching assignment. Short-term substitutes must be licensed teachers; however, they may be employed to teach any subject at any grade level. Long-term substitutes are defined as teachers employed for 20 or more consecutive days in the same teaching assignment. Long-term substitutes may be employed only in the subject and/or grade level of their licensure. Emergency licenses may be granted to long-term substitutes based upon the provisions of PI 3.01 and/or PI 3.02.
