**EXECUTIVE ORDER #158**

**Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin Be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Airman First Class Kelly Tomfohrde, Who Lost Her Life While Serving Her Country**

**WHEREAS**, on April 5, 2015, Airman First Class Kelly Tomfohrde, a member of the 115<sup>th</sup> Fighter Wing of the Wisconsin Air National Guard, died from injuries sustained in a fall while stationed at the Kadena Air Base in Japan; and

**WHEREAS**, Airman First Class Kelly Tomfohrde was a native of Auburndale, Wisconsin, a graduate of Auburndale High School, and a student at the University of Wisconsin—La Crosse; and

**WHEREAS**, for her faithful service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States, Airman First Class Kelly Tomfohrde received numerous awards, including the Air Force Achievement Medal, the Air Reserve Meritorious Service Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, and the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal; and

**WHEREAS**, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Airman First Class Kelly Tomfohrde; and

**WHEREAS**, a funeral service with full military honors will be held for Airman First Class Kelly Tomfohrde on Wednesday, April 22, 2015;

**NOW THEREFORE, I, SCOTT WALKER**, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State and by federal law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags, beginning at sunrise on **Wednesday, April 22, 2015**, and ending at sunset on that date.
