EXECUTIVE ORDER #152

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin Be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Firefighter James Ludlum of the Mineral Point Fire Department

WHEREAS, on January 6, 2022, Firefighter James Ludlum passed away in the line of duty;

WHEREAS, Firefighter James Ludlum devoted thirty-seven years of service to the Mineral Point Fire Department;

WHEREAS, Firefighter James Ludlum was dedicated to both his community and country, also serving twenty-two years in the U.S. Army Reserve;

WHEREAS, Firefighter James Ludlum impacted the lives of many through his passion for farming and work as an agricultural mechanic, his love of fishing, and as an active member of Ss. Mary and Paul Parish;

WHEREAS, his loss is borne by his family, friends, community, and the people of Wisconsin collectively, who are forever grateful for his service and sacrifice; and

WHEREAS, services for Firefighter James Ludlum will be held on Wednesday, January 12, 2022, in Mineral Point.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TONY EVERS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the Laws of the State, hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on Wednesday, January 12, 2022, and ending at sunset on that date.
