## PUBLIC NOTICE Department of Health Services DHS 75 Presumptive Drug Testing

The State of Wisconsin reimburses providers for services provided to Medical Assistance recipients under the authority of Title XIX of the Social Security Act and ss. 49.43 to 49.97, Wisconsin Statutes. This program, administered by the State's Department of Health Services (the Department), is called Medical Assistance (MA) or Medicaid. In addition, Wisconsin has expanded this program to create the BadgerCare Plus programs under the authority of Title XIX or Title XXI of the Social Security Act and s. 49.471 of the Wisconsin Statutes. Federal statutes and regulations require that a state plan be developed that provides the methods and standards for reimbursement of covered services. A plan that describes the reimbursement system for the services (methods and standards for reimbursement) is in effect.

## **Change in Covered Services and Payment Methods**

The Department is making the following changes: for outpatient SUD and Substance Ab use Day Treatment benefits, Wisconsin Medicaid will begin reimbursing DHS 75 certified facilities for point of care (presumptive) drug testing services rendered.

The change will be effective July 1, 2023 and will apply to claims with dates of service on or after that date. The change to Medicaid, and BadgerCare Plus is projected to result in increased annual expenditures of \$6,409,116.00 all funds (AF), composed of \$3,942,888.16 federal match (FED) and \$2,466,227.84 state funds/general purpose revenue (GPR).
