**Initial Regulatory Flexibility Analysis:** It is anticipated that this rule will have minimal impact to small businesses, including motorcycle rider education providers, as most of the changes to the administrative rule are already requirements of the current curriculum provider and have been implemented by rider education sites across the state.

Any procedures that need to occur are part of current practice and will not cost rider education sites or the Wisconsin Motorcycle Safety Program any additional funds. Monitoring of compliance is already taking place on a regular basis and will not need to be significantly adjusted to meet the guidelines of the updated administrative rule.
