Statutory authority: ss. 29.014(1), 29.041 and 227.11(2), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 29.014(1) and 29.041, Stats.

In this order:

Section 1 amends the definition of Lake Michigan to include waters of the Sturgeon bay ship canal east of the Wisconsin Public Service company power lines;

Section 2 amends the definition of Lake Winnebago system waters to reflect common usage of lake names in the area of the affected waters;

Section 3 amends the definition of Lake Mendota to eliminate an unnecessary reference to a legal description;

Section 4 creates a definition for Sheboygan marsh;

Section 5 clarifies the definition of an unattended line to specifically include the person using the line;

Section 6 creates a definition for Yellowstone lake to include the Yellowstone river upstream from the impoundment to county highway F;

Section 7 clarifies a cross-reference to authorized methods of fishing;

Section 8 clarifies the prohibition on fishing for a species of fish during the closed season;

Sections 9 and 53 eliminate the authorization for winter carp gaffing on Green Bay and Lake Michigan;

Section 10 allows the use of alewife as bait in Lake Michigan and Green Bay tributaries;

Sections 11, 24, 25, 51 and 52 authorize the use of spears to take panfish by skin or scuba diving in outlying waters;

Section 12 clarifies the restriction on the possession of untagged sturgeons;

Section 13 corrects a verb and clarifies the tagging requirement for harvested sturgeon;

Section 14 clarifies the restriction on the transportation of sturgeon;

Section 15 corrects a grammatical error related to registration of harvested sturgeon;

Section 16 clarifies the obligations of station operators at sturgeon registration stations;

Section 17 exempts "portable" fishing shelters from the requirement to display the owners or users name and address on the exterior;

Section 18 accommodates the use of circle hooks on setlines on the Winnebago system and eliminates the restriction on stainless steel hooks;

Section 19 clarifies the prohibition on the sale of turtles taken on setlines during the recently established closed season;

Section 20 clarifies the restriction on simultaneous possession of angling equipment and dip nets;

Section 21 expands the restriction on unattended dip nets to all waters of the state;

Section 22 clarifies the departments obligation to post waters that have been chemically treated for trout management as it relates to the use of minnow traps in those waters;

Section 23 corrects a grammatical error related to the requirement for a permit to set minnow traps in trout streams during the closed season for trout;

Sections 24, 25 and 26 clarify fishing methods that are specifically authorized under this chapter and simplify their presentation within the table;

Section 25 also clarifies a conflict between 2 existing restrictions related to taking fish by hand within 200 feet of a fishway, lock or dam;

Section 26 also eliminates redundancy with s. NR 20.20(73)(L) related to authorized methods for taking rough fish;

Section 28 corrects the restriction on trolling for Holcombe flowage, Chippewa county;

Section 29 corrects the dates when night fishing is prohibited on the lower Brule river, Douglas county;

Section 30 corrects a typographical error in the daily bag limit and minimum length or other size restrictions for trout regulations in Florence county;

Sections 31, 32 and 33 correct the spelling for Mullet lake, Fond du Lac county;

Section 36 corrects the date for the end of the catch and release bass season for Little Bass lake, Oneida county;

Section 37 adds Julia lake, Oneida county to the list of waters with a 40" minimum length limit for muskellunge. This water is in both Forest and Oneida counties but was inadvertently omitted from the Oneida county regulations;

Section 38 has been removed.

Sections 39 and 44 correct the size limit for walleye on the Fox river, Outagamie and Winnebago counties to accurately reflect the existing regulation as modified under s. NR 20.35;

Sections 40 and 41 remove Rock lake, which is located in Jefferson county, from Rock county regulations and corrects the minimum length limit for largemouth and smallmouth bass;

Section 42 corrects the authorization for seining of cisco and whitefish in Trout lake, Vilas county, which was inadvertently removed in a previous revision;

Section 43 eliminates the catch-and-release restrictions for trout on Soules Creek, Waushara county and returns it to the county-wide trout regulations (daily bag limit of 5 with a 7" minimum length limit);

Section 45 corrects the sturgeon spearing season on portions of the Lake Winnebago system. This authorization, which allows a season every 5 years, was inadvertently changed in a previous revision. This section also clarifies constraints on the sturgeon spearing season length as affected by s NR 20.33(5);

Section 46 clarifies the boundary separating muskellunge regulations on Lake Michigan;

Sections 47, 48, 49 and 50 authorize the use of hook and line to fish for minnows;

Sections 53, 54 and 55 authorize dip netting for suckers and other rough fish at any time on Lake Michigan, Green Bay and their tributaries;

Sections 56 and 57 reinstate an open season for white perch on Green Bay and expand the open season to tributaries of Lake Michigan and Green Bay;

Sections 58 and 59 clarify the departments authority to specify conditions on raising and emptying minnows traps used under a permit;

Sections 59m and 60 correct a cross-reference related to penalties for non-compliance of fishing tournament permits;

Section 61 eliminates the sunset on the fishing tournament permit program;

Sections 62 and 63 correct the opening date for the walleye and northern pike fishing season on the St. Croix river boundary waters with Minnesota;

Section 64 clarifies the prohibition on snagging in the Wisconsin-Minnesota boundary waters. This restriction was inadvertently removed in a previous revision;

Section 65 clarifies the prohibition on fishing by means other than hook and line within 200 feet of a fishway, lock or dam on the Wisconsin-Minnesota boundary waters. This restriction was inadvertently removed in a previous revision;

Section 66 corrects an inaccurate cross-reference regarding netting restrictions on Wisconsin-Minnesota boundary waters;

Section 67 eliminates the fish rearing pond grants program, which was repealed by 1995 Act 27.

SECTION 1. NR 20.03(17) is amended to read:

NR 20.03(17) "Lake Michigan" means those waters of Lake Michigan located east of the Green Bay-Lake Michigan line and those waters of the Sturgeon Bay ship canal east of a line located directly beneath the center of the Wisconsin public service company power lines.

SECTION 2. NR 20.03(19) is amended to read:

NR 20.09(3) Spear any game fish except that white bass, yellow bass, rock bass, panfish and bullheads may be speared while skin diving or scuba diving in inland waters during the open season for rough fish spearing on waters specified in s. NR 20.20.

SECTION 12. NR 20.10(4) is amended to read:

NR 20.10(4) Possess a validated sturgeon carcass tag in whole unless it is attached to a legally killed sturgeon while sturgeon spearing.

SECTION 13. NR 20.10(5) is amended to read:

NR 20.10(5) Possess a speared sturgeon unless immediately validating the sturgeon carcass tag by splitting slitting the marks designating the month, day, time and location of kill and immediately attaching the validated tag to the sturgeon carcass. Failure to completely validate the sturgeon carcass tag and immediately attach the tag to the sturgeon carcass renders the possession of the sturgeon illegal and the sturgeon carcass tag invalid. A sturgeon carcass tag shall be issued with each sturgeon spearing license and shall remain intact until the spearer spears a sturgeon.

SECTION 14. NR 20.10(6) is amended to read:

NR 20.10(6) Transport any <u>a</u> sturgeon in or on any motor driven vehicle <u>any manner</u> from the time the sturgeon is taken to the time it is lawfully registered pursuant to sub. (10) unless the sturgeon is carried openly exposed and in a manner so that the sturgeon carcass tag attached to the sturgeon cannot be handled or manipulated by any occupant of the vehicle.

SECTION 15. NR 20.10(10) is amended to read:

NR 20.10(10) Possess a sturgeon unless each person who has speared a sturgeon during the open season for spearing sturgeon shall exhibit exhibits the sturgeon, with the person's sturgeon carcass tag attached as required by s. 29.237, Stats., to a warden or other authorized department personnel at an official sturgeon registration station. Sturgeon shall be intact and registered at a station on Lake Winnebago if speared in Lake Winnebago. Sturgeon shall be intact and registered at a station on Lake Butte des Morts, Winneconne or Poygan if speared in Lake Butte des Morts, Winneconne or Poygan. Sturgeon shall be exhibited at a sturgeon registration station tag shall remain attached and locked to the sturgeon until the carcass is prepared for final consumption.
