2019 ASSEMBLY BILL 35

February 22, 2019 - Introduced by Representatives SPIROS, KUGLITSCH, MURPHY, RAMTHUN, SANFELIPPO, SKOWRONSKI, WICHGERS and ZIMMERMAN, cosponsored by Senators JACQUE, WANGGAARD, COWLES, MARKLEIN and OLSEN. Referred to Committee on Judiciary.

1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 943.10 (1m) (intro.) of the statutes; **relating to:** entering
2 certain places with intent to commit battery and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, it is a Class F felony to enter a dwelling or certain other places with intent to steal or commit a felony therein. Under the bill, it is a Class F felony to enter one of those places with the intent to commit battery, regardless of whether the battery was a misdemeanor or felony battery.

Because this bill creates a new crime or revises a penalty for an existing crime, the Joint Review Committee on Criminal Penalties may be requested to prepare a report.
