2019 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 54

July 3, 2019 – Introduced by Senators L. TAYLOR, TESTIN and OLSEN, cosponsored by Representatives Considine, Kurtz, Ohnstad, Sargent, Shankland, Mursau, Tusler, Kulp, L. Myers, Haywood, Schraa, Vruwink and Bowen. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

1 **Relating to:** recognizing June 3 to 9, 2019, as Hemp History Week in Wisconsin.

 $\mathbf{2}$ Whereas, in 1908, six acres were grown on the asylum farm at Mendota and 3 three acres on the prison farm at Waupun by the Agronomy department of the 4 Wisconsin Experiment Station in cooperation with the Office of Fiber Investigations 5 of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The results were so promising that the 6 investigational work was rapidly increased during 1909, 1910, and 1911. During 7 these years, fields were grown at Mendota, Waupun, and Viroqua. At each of these 8 points, good results were obtained. At Waupun, in 1911, the hemp was grown on land 9 badly infested with quack grass, and in spite of an unfavorable season, a yield of 10 2,100 pounds of fiber to the acre was obtained, and the quack grass was practically 11 destroyed; and

Whereas, the results were so encouraging that several neighboring farmers
became interested, and in 1912 grew a total of 125 acres. Since that time, hemp has
been grown in that vicinity every year as a commercial crop. During the last few

 years, the industry extended chiefly from Waupun to Brandon and through the region between Fairwater and Markesan; and 	d westward
3 Whereas, now the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and	d Consumer
4 Protection's industrial hemp research pilot program requires both g	rowers and
5 processors to obtain onetime licenses, and register each year that the	ey intend to
6 plant/process industrial hemp. Growers and processors must also pass b	background
7 checks and pay fees to participate in the program. The emergency adm	ninistrative
8 rule, ATCP 22, became effective March 2, 2018; and	
9 Whereas, this is a research pilot program permitted under terms	of the 2014
10 federal farm bill. As participants in the research program, growers and	d processors
11 will be required to report their research plans along with their annual re	egistrations,
12 and to file research reports for each growing season; and	
13 Whereas, hemp is now on firm footing in Wisconsin; the big obstacle	es have been
14 overcome, and with the 2018 federal farm bill, the final success of the ne	ew industry
15 is in Wisconsin's future; now, therefore, be it

17 Legislature recognizes June 3 to 9, 2019, as Hemp History Week in Wis	sconsin.
