# BadgerCare Base Reestimate (DHFS -- Health Care Financing -- Base Funding and Revenue) 

[LFB 2003-05 Budget Summary: Page 202, \#3]

## CURRENT LAW

BadgerCare funds health care costs for families with household income at or below $185 \%$ of the federal poverty level (FPL). Once enrolled, families can remain enrolled as long as their household income does not exceed $200 \%$ of the FPL. Individuals that are eligible for the state's medical assistance (MA) program are not eligible for BadgerCare. In 2003, 185\% of the FPL is equivalent to $\$ 28,231$ annually for a family of three.

As of the end of March, 2003, there were 106,654 individuals (71,108 adults and 35,546 children) enrolled in BadgerCare. The program is supported with: (a) GPR; (b) federal funds, including federal MA matching funds and funds the state receives under the state children's health insurance program (SCHIP); (c) program revenue, which is revenue from premiums paid by enrollees with income above $150 \%$ of the federal poverty level; and (d) segregated funding from the MA trust fund.

2002-03 Funding. 2003 Wisconsin Act 1 increased funding for BadgerCare program benefits by $\$ 33,661,900(\$ 9,587,000$ GPR, $\$ 23,061,700 \mathrm{FED}$, and $\$ 1,013,200 \mathrm{PR}$ ) in 2002-03 to fund a projected deficit. With the funding provided in Act 1, funding budgeted for BadgerCare totals \$192,007,200 (\$61,100,900 GPR, \$125,439,000 FED, \$4,306,600 PR, and \$1,160,700 SEG) in 2002-03.

## GOVERNOR

Provide $\$ 33,256,600$ ( $\$ 11,569,900$ GPR, $\$ 21,501,100$ FED, $\$ 892,300$ PR and $-\$ 706,700$ SEG) in 2003-04 and \$33,454,300 (\$11,654,200 GPR, \$21,653,500 FED, \$853,300 PR, and $-\$ 706,700 \mathrm{SEG})$ in 2004-05 to fund projected costs of BadgerCare benefits in the 2003-05 biennium, based on current law.

## DISCUSSION POINTS

1. It is currently estimated that the total cost of BadgerCare benefits in the next biennium, based on current law, will be $\$ 212,600,400$ ( $\$ 68,071,700$ GPR, $\$ 139,483,000$ FED, and $\$ 5,045,700 \mathrm{PR}$ ) in 2003-04 and \$229,959,400 (\$73,434,400 GPR, \$150,982,600 FED, and $\$ 5,542,400 \mathrm{PR}$ ) in 2004-05. Attachment 1 of this paper identifies the current estimate and the difference between this estimate and base funding for the program and the funding provided in the Governor's budget.

Compared with the funding provided in the bill for BadgerCare benefits, the current estimate represents an increase of $\$ 21,566,900(\$ 5,102,300 \mathrm{GPR}, \$ 15,604,600$ FED and $\$ 860,000$ PR) in 2003-04 and $\$ 38,728,200(\$ 10,380,700 \mathrm{GPR}, \$ 26,951,800$ FED and $\$ 1,395,700 \mathrm{PR}$ ) in 2004-05.
2. This estimate is based on more recent information regarding BadgerCare enrollment and costs than was available when the administration was preparing its estimate for inclusion in the Governor's bill. Additionally, this estimate includes revised estimates of enrollment and average costs. Neither the administration's estimate nor the current estimate includes funding to increase capitation payments made to health maintenance organizations (HMOs) serving BadgerCare enrollees or increases for fee-for-service providers.
3. The primary difference between the administration's estimate of total BadgerCare costs and the current estimate is attributable to different assumptions regarding the number of individuals that would be enrolled in BadgerCare in the next biennium. The current estimate assumes that the BadgerCare caseload will continue to grow at its current rate through the rest of this calendar year and then begin to slow for the rest of the biennium. The administration's estimate assumed that the BadgerCare caseload would total 105,078 by June 30, 2003, and would decrease by $1 \%$ per year in each year of the biennium. Attachment 2 of this paper compares the SB 44 enrollment projection with the current estimate.
4. It is believed that the weakened economy represents the primary contributing factor to BadgerCare enrollment growth over the last 18 months. Actual program enrollment and costs have exceeded projections since the program began in July, 1999. 2001 Wisconsin Act 1 and 2003 Wisconsin Act 1 both provided supplemental funding for BadgerCare benefits to address projected program deficits.
5. This estimate assumes that fee-for-services costs would increase by five percent
annually over the biennium, based on changes in the use of services not provided by HMOs. The administration's estimate assumed that fee-for-service costs would increase by $4.2 \%$ in 2003-04 and not increase in 2004-05. However, in the a letter to the Committee dated March 17, 2003, DOA Secretary Marotta requested that the funding budgeted for BadgerCare in the Governor's bill be increased by $\$ 884,600$ GPR and $\$ 1,748,900$ FED in $2003-04$ and $\$ 1,517,400$ GPR and $\$ 3,000,500$ FED in 2004-05 to reflect the administration's estimates of higher fee-for-service costs.

## MODIFICATION

Increase funding for BadgerCare benefits by $\$ 21,566,900$ ( $\$ 5,102,300 \mathrm{GPR}, \$ 15,604,600$ FED and $\$ 860,000 \mathrm{PR}$ ) in 2003-04 and by $\$ 38,728,200$ ( $\$ 10,380,700$ GPR, $\$ 26,951,800$ FED and $\$ 1,395,700 \mathrm{PR}$ ) in 2004-05 to fully fund BadgerCare benefits in the next biennium based on current law.
