Senate Bill 26, relating to: removing ineligible voters from the official voter registration list., withdrawn from the committee on Government Operations and rereferred to the committee on Shared Revenue, Elections and Consumer Protection.

Senate Bill 98, relating to: verifying citizenship of individuals on the official voter registration list and contents of operator's licenses and identification cards., withdrawn from the committee on Government Operations and rereferred to the committee on Shared Revenue, Elections and Consumer Protection.
