NR 47.93, Wis. Adm. Code Forestry research and development grant program

> Board Order No. FR-17-06 Clearinghouse Rule No. 06-022

### Basis and Purpose of the Proposed Rule

2005 Wisconsin Act 25 authorized the Department to promulgate rules for the forestry research and development grant program. The program is intended to provide grants to organizations experienced in the research, development and commercialization of technologies related to forestry biomass as energy and biochemical sources. The program is also intended to develop alternative sources of renewable energy utilizing forestry biomass, thereby improving the public health, the public good and the environment.

The rule will establish the purpose, applicability, definitions, grant solicitation and public notice, program administrator selection criteria and grant agreement provisions of the program. Grants will only be awarded as required match for funding provided by the federal government for for estry biomass research and development. It is the intent of the Department to contract with a program administrator to solicit grant applications, provide expert review and recommend grant awards to the Department. The Department does not have staff that has the expertise needed to evaluate forestry biomass energy or biochemical research, development or commercialization proposals.
