
**Subject:** Announcement of Public Hearing



The definition of "construction business" includes trades and businesses regulated by departmental codes that apply to the construction, installation or alteration of any element, component, material or device serving a building or structure. Businesses such as those involved in installing boilers, gas systems, piping, mechanical refrigeration systems, ski lifts and tows and permanent amusement rides will be required to register.
