FINAL REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY ANALYSIS

RULE NO.: 165- PT 1- PT 9

RELATING TO: Temporary Licensure

1. The agency's reason for including or failing to include in the proposed rule any of the methods specified under s. <u>227.114 (2)</u> for reducing its impact on small businesses.

These proposed rules seek to modernize the administrative rules governing physical therapy professionals pursuant to the passage of 2009 Wisconsin Act 149. The changes implemented by the proposed rules impact the daily practice of physical therapists and physical therapist assistants and will not impose any additional requirements on small business employers of physical therapist or physical therapist assistants. In light of these facts, it was determined there was no need to use any of the methods specified under s. 227.114 (2), Stats. for reducing the impact on small business in promulgating the proposed rules.

2. Summarize the issues raised by small businesses during the hearings on the proposed rule, any changes in the proposed rule as a result of alternatives suggested by small businesses and the reasons for rejecting any alternatives suggested by small businesses.

The Board did not receive any comments from small businesses during the time period in which the proposed rules were posted for comments or during the public hearing. As result, the Board did not make any changes to the proposed rules in response to comments from small businesses.

The proposed rules do not impose any new or additional reports on small businesses.
