

Clearinghouse Rule 13-116

**PROPOSED ORDER OF THE
STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION REPEALING PERMANENT
RULES**

The scope statement for this rule, SS 113-13, was published in Register No. 693, on September 14, 2013, and approved by State Superintendent Evers, on September 24, 2013. Per the Dane County Circuit Court order issued in *Coyne, et al. v. Walker, et al.*, Case No. 11-CV-4573, the Department of Public Instruction is not required to obtain the Governor's approval for the statement of scope or this rule.

The State Superintendent of Public Instruction hereby proposes an order to repeal PI 42, relating to the School Breakfast Program.

The rules are being adopted under s. 227.16(2)(b), Stats., which provides that rulemaking does not need to be preceded by notice and public hearing if the proposed rule brings an existing rule into conformity with a statute that has been changed.
