The 2013-15 budget, 2013 Wisconsin Act 20, made several modifications to the Milwaukee Parental Choice Program; the program was further modified by the 2015-17 budget, 2015 Wisconsin Act 55. The rule needs to be updated to reflect statutory changes and changes in practice.
