### RULEMAKING REPORT TO LEGISLATURE

#### CLEARINGHOUSE RULE CR 20-039

Ch. DHS 90, 103, 104, 105, 106, 107, 109, 152, 250, and 251

#### Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

The intent of the proposed rules is to repeal or amend rules that the department of health services ("the department") has identified as being in need of revision through the review process required under s. 227.29, Stats..

#### Department Response to Legislative Council Rules Clearinghouse Recommendations

The department accepted the recommendations made by the Legislative Council Rules Clearinghouse and has modified the proposed rules where suggested.

#### Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis

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The issues raised by each small business during the public hearing(s).

The proposed rules will not have an economic impact on small businesses, and no small businesses appeared at the public hearing to identify an issue with the proposed rules.

#### Changes to the Analysis or Fiscal Estimate/Economic Impact Analysis

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##### Analysis

The department modified the proposed rules to address the recommendations made by the Legislative Council Rules Clearinghouse. Additionally, the department made additional modifications to the proposed rules to correct an incorrect statutory reference. These modifications are as follows:

- statutory authority section was modified to more clearly cite to the statutes that authorize the proposed rule;
  - plain language analysis section was modified to include a description of each substantive change in the proposed rule;
  - universal change to remove all instance in which "(s)" is used to indicate that a word may be singular or plural;
  - DHS 90.10 (5) (f) 4. a. and 5. b. were modified to reorganize language for clarity;
  - DHS 103.04 (7) (d) was modified to clarify the applicable group and that the BadgerCare application must include the parents;
  - DHS 103.085 (3) (b) reorganized to incorporate subd. (1) directly into par. b.;
  - DHS 104.01 (3) was modified to update statutory reference from s. 146.48, Stats., to s. 146.81, Stats.
  - DHS 105.16 (6) (a) (intro.) modified to identify verb;
  - DHS 105.22 (1) (bn) modify to add references to s. 457.11 and 457.14, Stats.;
  - DHS 105.22 (1) (bo) modify to add reference to s. 457.14, Stats.; and
  - DHS 105.23 (1) (c) modify to clarify which providers holding a training or temporary licenses are excluded.
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#### Fiscal Estimate/Economic Impact Analysis

No changes were made to the fiscal estimate and economic impact analysis.

#### **Public Hearing Summary**

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The department began accepting public comments on the proposed rule via the Wisconsin Legislature Administrative Rules website, and through the Department's Administrative Rules Website on November 2, 2020.
