RULEMAKING REPORT TO LEGISLATURE

CLEARINGHOUSE RULE CR 22-019

Ch. DHS 77, Service Fund for People who are Deaf, Deafblind or Hard of Hearing

Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

Section 46.295 of the Statutes provides funding to pay for communication access services for people who are deaf, deafblind or hard of hearing in situations not required and funded by federal or other state law (hereinafter "the Service Fund"), and authorizes the department to promulgate rules to implement that fund. Chapter DHS 77 establishes eligibility requirements, application procedures, provider qualifications, circumstances eligible for reimbursement, and maintains a list of communication access services providers.

Chapter DHS 77 is currently outdated and does not reflect changes in federal and state laws that govern the provision of communication access services. In addition, the eligibility requirements for communication access services providers have not been updated to reflect required professional certifications and state licensure requirements, such as 2009 Wisconsin Act 360 and 2019 Wisconsin Act 17, which requires sign language interpreters to hold a professional license from the Department of Safety and Professional Services.

The objective of the proposed rule is to update and clarify Chapter DHS 77 to reflect current program operations, circumstances eligible for reimbursement and changes in the field of communication access services and providers for people who are deaf, hard of hearing and deafblind since the rule was last updated in 2002.
