### RULEMAKING REPORT TO LEGISLATURE

#### CLEARINGHOUSE RULE CR 22-073

Ch. DHS 110, relating to emergency medical services licensing, certification, and training requirements.

#### **Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule**

The proposed changes to Chapter DHS 110 modify the administrative rule to remove the requirement that advanced emergency medical technicians hold current certification in advanced cardiac life support as a professional responsibility of licensure. This requirement conflicts with Wisconsin Scope of Practice and Wisconsin Technical College educational requirements for advanced emergency medical technicians in Wisconsin. Furthermore, the current rule does not otherwise require advanced cardiac life support to obtain or renew an advanced emergency medical technician license. The proposed changes will eliminate the inconsistency with Chapter DHS 110. The proposed changes would simplify the licensing rules for the approximately 2,000 individuals within the state licensed at the advanced emergency medical technician level and bring Wisconsin in line with neighboring states and national standards.
