Policy Problem Addressed by the Rule The proposed rule removes advanced cardiac life support certification requirements for advanced emergency medical technicians not consistent with other provisions of administrative code and national EMS standards. The current rule's advanced cardiac life support requirement creates inconsistency and additional hardship for service providers and individuals licensed at the advanced emergency medical technician level who disproportionately serve small and rural communities within the state.</p>

Summary of the Businesses, Business Sectors, Associations Representing Business, Local Governmental Units, and Individuals that may be Affected by the Proposed Rule that were Contacted for Comments. Public comment was solicited as required and posted. No public comments were received during the 14-day economic impact public comment period.</p>

However, the Wisconsin Emergency Medical Services Board discussed concerns with the advanced life support certification requirement at the advanced emergency medical technician level beginning in December 2021. The department used advice from the Wisconsin Emergency Medical Services Advisory Board, representing a broad range of EMS providers and stakeholder associations who may be affected by the proposed rule, for use in analyzing and determining the economic impact that the proposed rules revisions would have on EMS services, businesses, individual practitioners, and local governments.</p>
