Every renewal period, licensees are required to also file evidence with the Department that they are certified in CPR or		
have been granted a waiver from the Chiropractic Examining Board. The CPR requirement is not required by Wisconsin		
statutes; however, it has been considered beneficial to the practice of Chiropractic for many years as a licensure		
requirement. The Board conducted an evaluation of ch. Chir 3 and has determined to remove the requirements relating to		
cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) in Wisconsin Administrative Code.

This rule removes the Administrative Code requirement for biannual CPR certification for Chiropractic licensure. DSPS		
estimates a total of \$5,900 in one-time costs and \$400 in annual costs for staffing and an indeterminate one-time IT		
impact to implement the rule. The estimated need for 0.1 limited term employees (LTE) is attributed to rule		
promulgation, staff training, and website and forms updates. The estimated annual staffing need accounts for staff tasks		
associated with customer service and communication with license applicants. The estimated costs cannot be absorbed in		
the currently appropriated agency budget.		
15. Benefits of Implementing the Rule and Alternative(s) to Implementing the Rule The benefits of implementing this rule are that chiropractors would not have a renewal requirement that is not consistent		
with the Statutes.		

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16. Long Range Implications of Implementing the Rule

The long range implications of implementing this rule are improved practice for Chiropractors in Wisconsin and better overall patient care.

Michigan: Michigan does not require a certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation as a requirement for licensure and renewal of Michigan chiropractic licenses.

Minnesota: Minnesota does not require a certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation as a requirement for licensure and renewal of Minnesota chiropractic licenses.
