

BARBER EXAMINING BOARD	:	AMENDING OR ADOPTING RULES

ORDER

Pursuant to authority vested in the Barbers Examining Board in ss. 15.08(5)(b), 227.014 and 457.02(1), Stats., the Barbers Examining Board hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules, interpreting ss. 457.04 and 457.14, Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. B 2.01(3) and 2.02(1)(intro.) are amended to read:

B 2.01(3) No barber or employe with a communicable disease ~~shall~~ may practice barbering.

B 2.02(1) No barber or employe in a barber shop or school ~~shall~~ may:

SECTION 2. B 2.03(3) is amended to read:

B. 2.03(3) Barbers ~~must~~ shall provide barbering services to the best of their ability and make reasonable efforts to comply with requests in a manner that is satisfactory to the customer. Barbers ~~shall~~ may not make public confidential information relating to barbering services provided to patrons.

SECTION 3. B 2.04(1) to (3) is amended to read:

B 2.04(1) Managers ~~must~~ shall maintain safe and sanitary shop conditions.

B 2.04(2) The manager ~~must~~ shall provide convenient hand washing facilities with hot and cold running water adjacent to work stations. Each station shall have a mirror, wet or dry sterilizer, hair cloth or cape, head rest, closed storage for hand tools, covered container for soiled towels and linen and other equipment necessary to provide safe and sanitary services.

B 2.04(3) Managers ~~must~~ shall provide clean and sanitary toilet facilities accessible to patrons and employes of the shop which do not require the patrons or employes to enter another place of business.

SECTION 4. B 2.05(2) is amended to read:

B 2.05(2) No barber shop ~~shall~~ may be open for the business of barbering unless the shop manager ~~therein~~ has a shop manager's license addressed to that location.

SECTION 5. B 2.08(intro.) and (1) of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended to read:

B 2.08 UNAUTHORIZED PRACTICE. Barbers shall assist in enforcement of ch. 458 457, Stats., and the Wisconsin Administrative Code, chs. B 1 to B 7, relating to barbering.

B 2.08(1) Barbers ~~shall~~ may not aid or abet the unauthorized practice of barbering.

SECTION 6. B 2.10(intro.) is amended to read:

B 2.10 UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT. Under s. 457.14(2)(h), Stats., no barber may engage in unprofessional conduct. The following may be considered by the board as evidence that a licensee or applicant for licensure ~~is not of good moral character,~~ has demonstrated unprofessional conduct:


SECTION 7. B 2.10(2) is repealed and recreated to read:

B 2.10(2) Violation of a standard of professional behavior which through professional experience has become established in the profession.

The rules amended and repealed and recreated and adopted in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register, pursuant to s. 227.026, Stats.
