Policy Problem Addressed by the Rule
The proposed rule change modifies PI 37 as a result of the 2013-15 budget, 2013 Wisconsin Act 20. 2013 Wisconsin Act 20 created s. 115.42 (1) (a) 5., Stats., which provides an additional requirement, that an applicant must have a rating of "effective" or "highly effective" in the applicable educator effectiveness system, in order to receive a grant for national teacher certification or master educator licensure. 2013 Wisconsin Act 20 also created s. 115.42 (2) (d), Stats., which states that in any of the 9 years following receipt of a grant, if the grant recipient fails to maintain a rating of "effective" or "highly effective" in the applicable educator effectiveness system, as determined by the department, he or she is not eligible for a grant in that school year.
Summary of Rule's Economic and Fiscal Impact on Specific Businesses, Business Sectors, Public Utility Rate Payers, Local Governmental Units and the State's Economy as a Whole (Include Implementation and Compliance Costs Expected to be Incurred)

This proposed rule change may change how many educators receive grants for national teacher certification or master educator licensure. It is unknown how many educators will no longer be eligible for grants for national teacher certification or master educator licensure under this rule change and thus the effect of the rule change is indeterminate but expected to be minimal.
Benefits of Implementing the Rule and Alternative(s) to Implementing the Rule
This proposed rule change is needed to align PI 37 with the statutory changes in the 2013-15 budget.
Long Range Implications of Implementing the Rule
Educators will only be eligible for a grant for national teacher certification or master educator licensure if they receive a rating of "effective" or "highly effective."
