Rule Information

The proposed rule addresses minor changes to administrative code relating to the regulation of fishing. The rule is being pursued to ensure the rule language that governs fishing in inland, outlying, and boundary waters is accurate and properly reflects the desired management of Wisconsin waters. The objectives are to; remove sections of code that are outdated or have been replaced by other statute or code changes, correct errors that occurred during the drafting of rules, and add or repeal language to clarify intent of original rules.

Initial Regulatory Flexibility Analysis:

The proposed rule will not have an effect on small businesses, as defined under s. 227.114 (1). The proposed rule will have minimal impact on sport anglers and is not expected to have an economic impact.
