

Transportation coordination

Transportation coordination involves human service agencies, transportation providers, consumer groups, and public officials working together to develop and improve services for individuals unable to provide their own transportation. Many of those served are not able to provide their own transportation as a result of disability, age or income. Transportation coordination provides more rides to more consumers through cooperation, communication and sharing resources, ensuring that transportation resources funded by local, state and federal programs are well-managed.

2019-2023 coordination plans updates

2019-2023 transportation coordination plan requirements

Federal transit law, as amended by the FAST Act (2015), requires that projects selected for funding

under the Section 5310, Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program be:

- 1. Must be included in a locally developed, coordinated public transit-human services transportation plan, and
- 2. The plan must also be developed and approved through a process that includes participation by seniors, individuals with disabilities, representatives of public, private, and nonprofit transportation and human services providers and other members of the public.

Federal law requires coordinated plans to be updated every four to five years and the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) has developed tools and forms to assist in these required updates.

2019-2023 coordination plan submittal and deadlines

Counties should submit plans electronically to BlackCat® Grant Management System by October 15, 2018. A guide has been developed to assist counties in submitting their plan into BlackCat® Grant Management System.

The development of coordination plans is led by the Regional Planning Commissions (RPCs) in Wisconsin, and WisDOT must receive a completed plan from each county.
