USDVA Updates

VARO is requesting that all service officers use the new version of the VA Form 21-0958, *Notice of Disagreement*. The new form allows for the selection of a DRO Review or the Traditional Appellate Review Process. Making a selection on the new form will help to speed up the appeals process and free up resources formerly used for sending DRO election letters.

The following is the SOP for the VA's Fully Developed Appeal Pilot program:

MILWAUKEE FULLY DEVELOPED APPEAL (FDA) PILOT STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE

<u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of the pilot is to reduce the number of appeals pending and increase customer service with VSOs and Veterans by reducing the appeals processing times.

What constitutes a FDA Appeal?

- NOD submitted on VAF 21-0958 (release date of September 2015)
- Election of the traditional or DRO review process on VAF 21-0958
- No request for personal telephone call or hearing on VAF 21-0958
- No additional evidence identified/required with the exception of VA medical records or VA exam

Process

- Appeals Team CAs will identify the FDA upon establishing the NOD. They will
 indicate in the "Assigned To" filed in the VACOLS diary screen "FDAD" for DRO
 review and "FDAT" for traditional process and a diary date of 12/01/17 will be
 entered.
- VSRs will not review these cases initially.
- DROs and RVSRs will work these cases as a priority and within workload guidelines established by the Appeals Team Coach.
- Rating decisions will be processed under regularly established guidelines.
