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- \$75 million available in one-time general purpose revenue funding (GPR)
- Program Overview
 - Multimodal project eligibility
 - Expanded Local Sponsor eligibility
 - Funding for new projects only
 - Up to 90% state cost share
 - Local delivery, local administration
 - Project funding thresholds
 - Project reimbursement

- MLS funding is available for new projects
 - Local Road improvements
 - Local Bridge improvements
 - Transit vehicle purchases, facility construction
 - Bicycle/Pedestrian facilities
 - Railroad improvements
 - Port & Harbor improvements
- Design-only projects and planning studies are ineligible for MLS funding
- Maintenance activities are ineligible for MLS funding

- MLS funding availability is divided into three categories
 - Counties
 - Cities/Villages
 - Towns
- Minimum MLS total project cost
 - \$250,000 for counties/cities/villages
 - **\$50,000** for towns
- Maximum MLS project award: \$3,500,000
- Six-year project completion requirement

- MLS selection committee structure
 - Counties
 - Cities/Villages
 - Towns
- MLS application evaluation Maximum 50 points
 - Modal score no modal type preference
 - Maximum 25 points
 - Other factors for evaluation
 - Maximum 25 points
 - Economic Impact
 - Connectivity
 - Cost Effectiveness
 - Other Considerations



- MLS project sponsors
 - Local units of government with the taxing authority to guarantee availability of local match funds
 - Wisconsin's eleven federally recognized tribal governments
 - Private organizations as secondary sponsors

- Real estate project costs over \$100,000
- Utility costs related to relocation, removal or new utilities are ineligible
- State and federal environmental regulations need to be coordinated through the appropriate regulatory agency
- Complex projects with a federal interest or urban area regional significance may require state oversight

 - Appropriate modal sections
 - Narrative restricted to one page
 - Signed by local official with legal authority
 - Maps indicating project location
 - Total project cost estimates
 - Eligible and ineligible costs



This is a field to provide a detailed description of the project beyond what has already been provided in previous sections. Prepare the project narrative in a Word document, complete a spell check, and cut and paste the summary into the application form. Provide supporting project documentation such as any permits/licenses (including issuing agency & start/end dates) and any relevant transportation/bike-pedestrian/comprehensive planning documents. Describe potential project impact on regional economic activity, including freight movement (e.g., specific shipping/receiving facilities), worker access to employment opportunities and overall economic connectivity enhancements. Describe potential project impacts on safety and regional quality of life. Describe any relevant environmental/cultural issues, including any Section 4(f) and Section 6(f) concerns.

Include any information that demonstrates the viability of the proposed project by showing its value based on service life, economic benefits or in comparison to other alternatives. This may include benefit-cost analysis or other calculations.

A separate attached document <u>not exceeding 1 page</u> (double spaced, 10 pt. font) may be substituted for this section.

MLS Selection Process

- Projects are selected by committees comprised of local officials
- Each committee reviews all eligible applications, scores projects, determines funding cost share, and makes final selection of projects that are forwarded to the WisDOT Secretary for approval
- WisDOT MLS staff facilitates committee meetings
- Project awards are announced in early 2020

MLS Selection Process

- Project Scoring Rubric
 - Modal types can receive a maximum of 25 points
 - Priority or additional points are not given to specific modal types
 - Universal scoring factors can add up to 25 additional points
 - Economic impacts to the community or region up to 10 points
 - Connectivity with other modes and to job centers or access to community services – up to 5 points
 - Cost effectiveness project scope value compared to treatment alternatives – up to 5 points
 - Other considerations as determined by committee, e.g., regional significance – up to 5 points



- Project design standards in accordance with
 - Counties: Transportation Code 205
 - Cities/Villages: Facilities Development Manual (FDM) 11-20-1
 - Towns: Transportation Code 204
 - Exception to Standards requirements within the Trans Codes apply
- Project complexity, federal action(s), and urbanized regional significance are factors used to determine the need for state oversight
 - State administrative oversight can be requested by a sponsor regardless of project complexity

- Sponsors are responsible for all project costs incurred prior to completion of a signed state municipal agreement (SMA) and notification of authorization to incur costs from WisDOT
- MLS projects must not be advertised for bid until a signed SMA has been executed
- MLS projects must be competitively bid and awarded to the lowest responsible bidder

- MLS projects must be advertised for a minimum of 15 days (i.e., two consecutive weeks)
 - Award is to the lowest responsible bid
 - Advertisement and low bid award documentation must be submitted with request of reimbursement
 - Wis. Stats. § 16.855, 66.0901, 985.01(1m), 985.07
- Counties are eligible to bid on MLS projects
 - Not subject to LRIP program rule Wis. Stats. § 86.31(6)(h)(3)
 - Counties are subject to all other county bidding and work rule restrictions as noted in Wis. Stats. § 59.52(30)

- MLS project components cannot be bid separately
 - One MLS project One MLS contract award
- Consultants that complete an MLS application are eligible to respond to the design solicitation

- MLS is a reimbursement program
- Documentation for reimbursement
 - A copy of the advertisement to bid (Affidavit of Publication)
 - Lowest responsible bid award and rejection notices or dated board minutes
 - Exception to Standards (if applicable)
 - Proof of permits
 - Documentation that confirms contractor payment

- Reimbursement for all eligible project costs is contingent on project completion within the six year sunset window
- Reimbursement for all eligible project costs will not exceed MLS award
- Local project sponsors are required to maintain all project documentation and submit to WisDOT upon request in the event of a project review or project audit
