Medicaid Reimbursement for Inpatient and Outpatient Hospital Services Rate Year 2023

The State of Wisconsin reimburses providers for services provided to Medical Assistance recipients under the authority of Title XIX of the Social Security Act and ss. 49.43 to 49.47, Wisconsin Statutes. This program, administered by the State's Department of Health Services (the Department), is called Medical Assistance (MA) or Medicaid. In addition, Wisconsin has expanded this program to create the BadgerCare Plus programs under the authority of Title XIX and Title XXI of the Social Security Act and s. 49.471 of the Wisconsin Statutes. Federal statutes and regulations require that a state plan be developed that provides the methods and standards for reimbursement of covered services. A plan that describes the reimbursement system for hospital services is in effect.

Change in Covered Services and Payment Methods

The Department is making the following changes to the sections in Wisconsin's state plan related to hospital reimbursement.

— Modify outpatient section 4200 to create a new outpatient payment per visit add-on for outpatient dental services where deep sedation is provided.

The change will be effective January 1, 2023. The change to Medicaid, BadgerCare, and BadgerCare Plus is projected to result in increased annual expenditures of \$1.5 million all funds (AF), composed of \$950,100 federal match (FED) and \$549,900 state funds/general purpose revenue (GPR).
