## PUBLIC NOTICE Department of Health Services Continuation of suspension of premiums related to the Public Health Emergency (PHE)

The State of Wisconsin reimburses providers for services provided to Medical Assistance recipients under the authority of Title XIX of the Social Security Act and ss. 49.43 to 49.47 and 49.472, Wisconsin Statutes. This program, administered by the State's Department of Health Services (the Department), is called Medical Assistance (MA) or Medicaid. Federal statutes and regulations require that a state plan be developed that provides the methods and standards for reimbursement of covered services. A plan that describes the reimbursement system for the services (methods and standards for reimbursement) is in effect.

## **Change in Covered Services and Payment Methods**

The Department is maintaining a suspension of premiums for the Medicaid Purchase Plan (MAPP) thru December 31, 2023, in order to continue qualifying for enhanced federal funding.

The change will be effective May 12, 2023. The change to Medicaid is projected to result in increased annual expenditures of \$0 all funds (AF), composed of \$0 federal match (FED) and \$0 state funds/general purpose revenue (GPR).
