**SENATE AMENDMENT 1,  
TO SENATE BILL 156**

April 9, 2019 – Offered by Senator KOOYENGA.

- 1           At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:
- 2           **1.** Page 2, line 2: delete lines 2 to 10 and substitute:
- 3           “443.015 (**1m**) (a) 1. Each section of the examining board shall promulgate
- 4 rules to do all of the following:
- 5           a. Allow the holder of a credential under this chapter who is at least 65 years
- 6 of age or has actively maintained that credential for at least 30 consecutive years and
- 7 who certifies that he or she has retired from and no longer engages in the practice
- 8 for which he or she holds the credential to apply to the board to classify that
- 9 credential as retired status.
- 10           b. Allow an individual who previously held a credential under this chapter, and
- 11 failed to renew that credential prior to the renewal date, to apply to the board to
- 12 renew the credential with retired status if the individual is at least 65 years of age
- 13 or had actively maintained that credential for at least 30 consecutive years, certifies

1 that he or she has retired from and no longer engages in the practice for which he or  
2 she previously held the credential, and pays the fee under par. (d). Section 440.08  
3 (3) (a) and (b) does not apply to the renewal of such a credential.

4 c. Allow the holder of a credential classified as retired status as described under  
5 subd. 1. a. or b. to apply to the appropriate section of the examining board to remove  
6 the retired status classification if he or she satisfies reinstatement requirements  
7 established by the appropriate section of the examining board by rule.

8 2. Rules promulgated under subd. 1. may not require a certification to be  
9 notarized.”.
