**SENATE AMENDMENT 1,
TO SENATE BILL 688**

January 11, 2022 – Offered by Senator JACQUE.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 **1.** Page 1, line 3: after “personnel” insert “, extending the time limit for
3 emergency rule procedures, providing an exemption from emergency rule
4 procedures,”.

5 **2.** Page 5, line 2: after that line insert:

6 “(5) The department may promulgate any rules necessary for the
7 administration of this section.”.

8 **3.** Page 6, line 3: after that line insert:

9 **“SECTION 6. Nonstatutory provisions.**

10 (1) The department of safety and professional services may promulgate
11 emergency rules under s. 227.24 to implement s. 440.077 (5). Notwithstanding s.
12 227.24 (1) (c) and (2), emergency rules promulgated under this subsection remain in
13 effect until December 1, 2023, or the date on which permanent rules take effect,

whichever is sooner. Notwithstanding s. 227.24 (1) (a) and (3), the department of safety and professional services is not required to provide evidence that promulgating a rule under this subsection as emergency rules is necessary for the preservation of public peace, health, safety, or welfare and is not required to provide a finding of emergency for a rule promulgated under this subsection.

(2) The medical examining board may promulgate emergency rules under s. 227.24 to establish minimum standards for military medical personnel under s. 448.40 (1m). Notwithstanding s. 227.24 (1) (c) and (2), emergency rules promulgated under this subsection remain in effect until December 1, 2023, or the date on which permanent rules take effect, whichever is sooner. Notwithstanding s. 227.24 (1) (a) and (3), the medical examining board is not required to provide evidence that promulgating a rule under this subsection as emergency rules is necessary for the preservation of public peace, health, safety, or welfare and is not required to provide a finding of emergency for a rule promulgated under this subsection.”.

4. Page 6, line 4: delete lines 4 to 6 and substitute:

“SECTION 7. Effective dates. This act takes effect on September 1, 2022, or on the day after publication, whichever is later, except as follows:

(1) SECTION 6 of this act takes effect on the day after publication.”.
