Section 6008 of the Act provides that the Department, in order to qualify for enhanced federal funding, must maintain continuous Medicaid elegibility for persons enrolled in Medicaid, unless the person leaves the state or requests disenrollment, and not increase Medicaid premiums during the time periods designated in the Act..

Compare With Approaches Being Used by Neighboring States (Illinois, low a, Michigan and Minnesota) In order for our neighboring states to become compliant with the s. 6008 of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act, P.L. 116-127, they are also required to make these policy changes; therefore, they are also weighing the cost/benefit of receiving the increased federal funding compared to the potential for increased expenditures for extending coverage to the impacted members.

It is more favorable for Wisconsin to enact the proposed rules by over \$100 million per quarter.
