2021 Wisconsin Act 213 [2021 Senate Bill 398]

Special Observance Day of 9/11 in Schools

State law designates certain dates for the observance of events or persons in Wisconsin schools. Under **prior law**, 21 days were designated for special observance in schools¹ when school is held or, if the day falls on a Saturday or Sunday, on a school day immediately preceding or following that special observance day. **2021 Wisconsin Act 213** designates September 11, as the day to "remember the attacks that occurred on September 11, 2001, and to honor law enforcement officers and firefighters."

Anthony's birthday; (d) George Washington's birthday; (e) Casimir Pulaski Day; (f) "The Great Hunger" in Ireland from 1845 to 1850; (g) Prisoners of War Remembrance Day; (h) American Creed Day; (i) Patriots' Day; (j) Environmental Awareness Day; (k) Arbor Day, or Arbor and Bird Day if declared by the Governor; (l) Robert M.
