2021 Wisconsin Act 90 [2021 Senate Bill 555]

Requiring Information on Relinquishing a Newborn in Human Growth and Development Courses

BACKGROUND

Under current law, the parent of a child who is 72 hours old or younger may relinquish custody of the child to a law enforcement officer, emergency medical services practitioner, or hospital staff member. A parent who relinquishes a newborn in this manner may do so anonymously and confidentially, and is immune from civil or criminal liability for any good faith act or omission connected with the relinquishment. [s. <u>48.195</u>, Stats.]

Under current law, school districts are not required to provide instruction in human growth and development. However, if a school district provides instruction in human growth and development, it must ensure it includes instruction in certain subjects. [s. <u>118.019</u>, Stats.]

2021 WISCONSIN ACT 90

Act 90 specifies that if a school district provides instruction in human growth and development, it must ensure the instruction includes an explanation of the process under s. <u>48.195</u>, Stats., for relinquishing a newborn.
