## 2019 ASSEMBLY BILL 1001

March 11, 2020 – Introduced by Representatives McGuire, Haywood, Brostoff and Stubbs. Referred to Committee on Education.

1 AN ACT to amend 119.04 (1); and to create 20.255 (2) (dq) and 115.453 of the 2 statutes; relating to: grants for participation in esports competitions and 3 making an appropriation.

### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a pilot program under which the Department of Public Instruction awards grants to eligible teams for expenses related to participating in esports competitions. Under the bill, an esports competition is an organized, multiplayer video game competition. To be eligible for an esports participation grant, a team must be comprised of pupils and at least one mentor and must demonstrate to DPI that it will provide matching funds equal to the amount of the grant. Under the bill, DPI must administer the esports participation grant pilot program in the 2020–21, 2021–22, and 2022–23 school years. Finally, the bill requires DPI to publish a list of grant recipients on its Internet site and to submit a report on the pilot program to the legislature.

20	of home-based private educational programs that applications for grants to
21	participate in one or more esports competitions will be accepted from eligible teams
22	through a date set forth in the notice. As a condition of receiving a grant under this
23	section, an applicant eligible team shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of the

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1 department that the applicant eligible team will provide matching funds in an  $\mathbf{2}$ amount equal to the amount awarded under this section. 3 (b) In the 2020-21, 2021-22, and 2022-23 school years, from the appropriation 4 under s. 20.255 (2) (dq), the department shall award grants to eligible teams selected  $\mathbf{5}$ from the applicants under par. (a). Grant funds awarded under this section may be applied only towards allowable expenses.
