2021 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 79

September 20, 2021 - Introduced by Representatives DITTRICH, STEINEKE and DUCHOW, cosponsored by Senator Jagler. Referred to Committee on Rules.

Relating to: proclaiming August 17, 2021, as Locked-in Syndrome Day in 1 $\mathbf{2}$ Wisconsin. Whereas, locked-in syndrome is a rare neurological disorder in which 3 cognitively intact individuals have complete paralysis of nearly all voluntary 4 5 muscles in the body, except for the muscles that control the eyes; and 6 Whereas, locked-in syndrome is caused by damage to a portion of the brain 7 stem known as the pons, which can be the result of stroke, diseases of the circulatory system, traumatic brain injury, medication overdose, or poisoning, among other 8 9 things; and 10 Whereas, an individual with locked-in syndrome is alert and aware of his or her environment and can fully comprehend others' speech; and 11 12 Whereas, many of those with locked-in syndrome are able to communicate with

others through eye movements or blinking; and

Whereas, the development of new brain-computer interfaces, such as infrared
eye movement sensors and computer voice prosthetics, are allowing patients to more
easily communicate with others and even access the Internet; and
Whereas, there is currently no specific treatment or cure for the disorder and
it is extremely rare for any significant motor function to return for locked-in
syndrome patients; and
Whereas, many cases of locked-in syndrome may go unrecognized or
misdiagnosed; now, therefore, be it
Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the legislature
hereby proclaims August 17, 2021, as Locked-in Syndrome Day in Wisconsin to

bring awareness to this rare and devastating neurological disorder.
