2021 SENATE BILL 294

- April 8, 2021 Introduced by Senators JOHNSON, ROTH, CARPENTER, DARLING, LARSON, RINGHAND and L. TAYLOR, cosponsored by Representatives SNODGRASS, BILLINGS, BALDEH, TUSLER, ANDERSON, ANDRACA, CABRAL-GUEVARA, EMERSON, HEBL, SHELTON, SINICKI, SPREITZER and SUBECK. Referred to Committee on Human Services, Children and Families.
- 1 AN ACT to amend 48.84 (2g) (a) of the statutes; relating to: pre-adoption 2 training formats.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a proposed adoptive parent must complete 25 hours of pre-adoption training. Of these 25 hours, 6 hours must be completed in person and 6 hours must be targeted toward the specific needs of the child to be adopted. This bill allows adoptive parents to complete the in-person training requirements through a live videoconference.

4	48.84 (2g) (a) At least 6 hours of training that is provided in person <u>or through</u>
5	<u>a live videoconference session</u> , either individually or in a group.
