## 2023 ASSEMBLY BILL 829

December 22, 2023 – Introduced by Representatives BILLINGS, J. ANDERSON, JOERS, C. ANDERSON, CLANCY, CONLEY, DRAKE, EMERSON, JACOBSON, MADISON, MOORE OMOKUNDE, NEUBAUER, OHNSTAD, ORTIZ-VELEZ, PALMERI, RATCLIFF, SHELTON, SINICKI, STUBBS and VINING, cosponsored by Senators SMITH, ROYS, TAYLOR, HESSELBEIN, LARSON, SPREITZER and AGARD. Referred to Committee on Colleges and Universities.

1 AN ACT to create 20.235 (1) (dm) and 39.467 of the statutes; relating to: climate

change scholarships and making an appropriation.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a climate change scholarship program to be administered by the Higher Educational Aids Board. The program provides scholarships to students who are enrolled in an institution of higher education and who are engaged in studies directly related to programs preparing the students for careers in occupational areas addressing or responding to climate change. A student may not receive more than \$5,000 in scholarships under this program in each academic year.

3	49.854 $\left(2\right)$ (b), unless the student provides to the board a payment agreement that

5	consistent with rules promulgated under s. $49.858(2)(a)$ .
