2023 SENATE BILL 244

April 14, 2023 - Introduced by Senators Jacque and Spreitzer, cosponsored by Representatives Tittl, Conley, C. Anderson, Baldeh, Brandtjen, Emerson, Joers, Mursau, Ohnstad, Ortiz-Velez, Palmeri, Schmidt, Stubbs, Subeck, Wichgers and Behnke. Referred to Committee on Mental Health, Substance Abuse Prevention, Children and Families.

- 1 AN ACT to amend 49.148 (1m) (title) and 49.148 (1m) (a) 2. of the statutes;
- 2 **relating to:** expanding Wisconsin Works eligibility for at-risk pregnancy.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person who is not a custodial parent of a dependent child may be eligible for Wisconsin Works benefits if the person is an unmarried woman who meets the other eligibility criteria and is in the third trimester of a pregnancy that is medically verified and is shown by medical documentation to be at risk and to render the woman unable to participate in the workforce.

This bill extends the criteria for these benefits to any woman who is already the custodial parent of a dependent child and who is in any stage of a medically verified and documented at-risk pregnancy.

49.148 (1m) (a) 2. An unmarried A woman who meets the eligibility requirements under s. 49.145 (2) and (3) or who would be eligible under s. 49.145 except that she is not a custodial parent of a dependent child and who is in the 3rd trimester of a pregnancy that is medically verified and that is shown by medical documentation to be at risk and to render the woman unable to participate in the workforce.
