2023 SENATE BILL 960

Johnson, Taylor, Wirch and Larson, cosponsored by Representatives Stubbs, Goeben, Behnke, Conley, Considine, Dittrich, Drake, Emerson, Gundrum, Hurd, Kitchens, Madison, Moore Omokunde, Murphy, O'Connor, Ohnstad, Palmeri, Sinicki and Brandtjen. Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the Department of Justice, in consultation with the Technical College System Board, the Department of Safety and Professional Services, and the Cosmetology Examining Board, to identify and establish industry specific materials for use in providing instruction to students in schools of barbering, schools of cosmetology, and specialty schools in the recognition and reporting of human trafficking. Specialty schools are establishments that offer instruction in aesthetics, electrology, or manicuring. Further, under the bill, DSPS and the Cosmetology Examining Board must require that schools of barbering, schools of cosmetology, and specialty schools provide instruction on the dynamics of exploitation including vulnerabilities that put people at risk of being trafficked and how to recognize and report suspected human trafficking as identified by DOJ under the bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

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1	SECTION 1. 165.715 of the statutes is created to read:
2	165.715 Prevention of human trafficking. The department of justice, in
3	consultation with the technical college system board, the department of safety and
4	professional services, and the cosmetology examining board, shall, no later than one
5	year following the effective date of this section [LRB insert date], identify and
6	establish industry specific materials for use in providing instruction to students in
7	schools of barbering licensed under s. 440.62 (3) (ag), schools of cosmetology licensed
8	under s. 440.62 (3) (ar), and specialty schools licensed under s. 440.62 (4) in the
9	recognition and reporting of human trafficking, including both sex trafficking and
10	labor trafficking.

The department shall require that schools of barbering provide instruction on the dynamics of exploitation including vulnerabilities that put people at risk of being trafficked and how to recognize and report suspected human trafficking as identified by the department of justice under s. 165.715.
