1     **Relating to:** honoring the life and public service of Representative Jonathan  
2         Brostoff.

3         Whereas, Representative and Alderman Jonathan Francis Brostoff, a  
4         dedicated public servant, husband, father, son, brother, and friend, passed away on  
5         November 4, 2024, at the age of 41; and

6         Whereas, Jonathan Brostoff was born on September 25, 1983, in Milwaukee,  
7         Wisconsin, as the second of two sons to Phyllis and Alan Brostoff; and

8         Whereas, Jonathan Brostoff graduated from Kradwell School and went on to  
9         receive his bachelor's degree from the University of Wisconsin – Milwaukee (UWM),  
10         earning a degree in political science in 2011; and

11         Whereas, Jonathan Brostoff, while attending UWM, worked for Senator Tom  
12         Harkin in Washington, D.C., served as chair of the College Democrats, and  
13         completed the United Nations Summer Seminar program; and

14         Whereas, Jonathan Brostoff was elected to the Wisconsin Assembly

1 representing the 19th Assembly District and served from 2014 to 2023, serving on  
2 the Assembly Committees on Aging and Long-Term Care; Constitution and Ethics;  
3 Family Law; Financial Institutions; Government Accountability and Oversight;  
4 Mental Health; Natural Resources and Sporting Heritage; State Affairs and  
5 Government Operations; Regulatory Licensing Reform; Ways and Means; and on  
6 the Speaker's Task Force on Alzheimer's and Dementia and the Speaker's Task  
7 Force on Suicide Prevention; and

8       Whereas, Jonathan Brostoff was a fierce and tenacious advocate for criminal  
9 justice reform, for safeguarding licensing regulations for workforce professionals,  
10 and, most notably, for disability rights, where he famously did not cut his curly hair  
11 until a bill supporting American Sign Language access became law, with his  
12 eventual haircut featured in the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel; and

13       Whereas, Jonathan Brostoff was elected to the Milwaukee Common Council in  
14 2022 as alder from the third district and served on the Judiciary & Legislation;  
15 Public Works; Zoning, Neighborhoods, & Development; and Steering & Rules  
16 Committees; and

17       Whereas, Jonathan Brostoff genuinely cared for the well-being of others,  
18 dedicating his time each week to volunteer at Pathfinders, a youth shelter, and  
19 Maryland Avenue Montessori School in Milwaukee, while also staying involved  
20 with Dryhootch, a nonprofit supporting veterans, and actively engaging as an  
21 alumnus of Milwaukee's Public Allies program; and

22       Whereas, Jonathan Brostoff built relationships with Wisconsinites across  
23 party and class, believing that working across differences was vital for a working  
24 democracy; and
