



2025 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 66

June 6, 2025 - Introduced by Representatives TRANEL, NOVAK, KURTZ, JOHNSON, J. JACOBSON, BROWN, GOODWIN, MIRESE, MURPHY, O'CONNOR, PRADO, SINICKI, STROUD and STUBBS, cosponsored by Senators MARKLEIN, PFAFF, KEYESKI, RATCLIFF, ROYS and SPREITZER. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1 **Relating to:** congratulating Southwest Wisconsin Technical College for winning
2 the 2025 Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence.

3 Whereas, Southwest Wisconsin Technical College, located in Fennimore,
4 Wisconsin, is a part of the Wisconsin Technical College System, a statewide
5 network of colleges that provides accessible, affordable, and high-quality education
6 and training to support Wisconsin's workforce and communities; and

7 Whereas, the Aspen Institute College Excellence Program awards the
8 prestigious Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence to recognize community
9 colleges that achieve high and improving levels of student success, particularly for
10 students from historically underserved backgrounds; and

11 Whereas, the Aspen Prize is awarded every two years and is based on rigorous
12 data analysis, interviews with leadership, faculty, staff, students, and community
13 members, and site visits to finalist colleges; and

14 Whereas, in 2025, Southwest Wisconsin Technical College was selected as the

1 winner of the Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence, earning a \$700,000
2 award and being named the top two-year college in the country; and

3 Whereas, the Aspen Institute College Excellence Program praised Southwest
4 Wisconsin Technical College for its robust teaching and learning practices, strong
5 relationships with employers and four-year university partners, effective advising,
6 and programs that include work-based learning and other high-impact practices;
7 now, therefore, be it

8 ***Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That*** the Wisconsin
9 State Legislature commends and congratulates Southwest Wisconsin Technical
10 College on this extraordinary national recognition and extends its appreciation to
11 the college's faculty, staff, students, and community partners for their outstanding
12 contributions to higher education in Wisconsin.
