

## **2025 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 76**

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This constitutional amendment, proposed to the 2025 legislature on first consideration, eliminates the constitutional restriction that only a marriage between one man and one woman shall be valid or recognized as a marriage in this state and the provision that a legal status identical or substantially similar to that of a marriage for unmarried individuals shall not be valid or recognized in this state.

A proposed constitutional amendment requires adoption by two successive legislatures, and ratification by the people, before it can become effective.

*Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That:*SECTION 1. Section 13 of article XIII of the constitution is amended so as in
effect to repeal said section:
[Article XIII] Section 13. Only a marriage between one man and one woman

shall be valid or recognized as a marriage in this state. A legal status identical or
 substantially similar to that of marriage for unmarried individuals shall not be
 valid or recognized in this state.
