2025 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 49

May 9, 2025 - Introduced by Senators Tomczyk, Testin, Habush Sinykin, Jacque, Larson, Pfaff, Ratcliff, Spreitzer, Wall, Wimberger and Wirch, cosponsored by Representatives Snyder, Krug, Bare, Brown, Donovan, Emerson, Hong, Johnson, Kaufert, Kitchens, Knodl, McCarville, Melotik, Miresse, Moses, Neubauer, O'Connor, Palmeri, Rivera-Wagner, Roe, Sheehan, Sinicki, Snodgrass, Tenorio, Tranel, Wichgers, Wittke and Subeck. 1 Relating to: commemorating Hmong-Lao Veterans Day and honoring the Hmong-2 Lao veterans who served alongside the United States in the Vietnam War. 3 Whereas, during the Vietnam War, the Central Intelligence Agency and U.S. 4 Armed Forces recruited, organized, trained, and assisted Hmong-Lao forces to 5 combat the North Vietnamese Army and Pathet Lao forces; and 6 Whereas, thousands of Hmong-Lao people courageously fought alongside 7 Americans throughout the Vietnam War and, facing harsh retribution from the 8 Vietnamese and Lao governments following the war's end, many were ultimately 9 forced to flee their homes; and 10 Whereas, on May 14, 1975, the last of the Hmong-Lao soldiers and their 11 families fled Laos for the Nam Phong refugee camp in Thailand to later resettle in 12 communities throughout the United States, including Wisconsin, and today, our 13 state is home to a significant number of Hmong-Lao veterans; and 14 Whereas, in accordance with 2021 Wisconsin Act 31, May 14 of each year is 12

1 designated as a day to thank Hmong-Lao veterans in Wisconsin for their service $\mathbf{2}$ and sacrifice, recall the accomplishments of Hmong-Lao veterans, and encourage 3 schools to include the military service of Hmong-Lao veterans in discussions and 4 curriculums about the Vietnam War: and 5 Whereas, the Wisconsin Lao Veterans of America (WLVA) has established 6 chapters throughout our state to serve local communities and educate the public 7 about the contributions of our Hmong-Lao veterans during the Vietnam War; and 8 Whereas, today, the state of Wisconsin joins the WLVA and all Wisconsinites 9 in reflecting on the tremendous, and too often overlooked, heroism and sacrifice of 10 Hmong-Lao veterans in our state; now, therefore, be it 11 Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the members of the Wisconsin Legislature recognize May 14, 2025, and May 14, 2026, as Hmong-13 Lao Veterans Day and pay tribute to those Hmong-Lao veterans who honorably and 14 bravely served alongside the United States in the Vietnam War.
