TESTIMONY BEFORE THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY COMMITTEE

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ADOPTION AND TPR RELATED ITEMS FROM THE CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES REVIEW PROGRAM ENHANCEMENT PLAN

1. Concurrent Plan at 6 Months

- Develop policy/procedure to require a concurrent permanency plan no later that the six-month permanency review.
 - Issue a numbered memo.
 - Provide training and technical assistance.
 - Include the policy in HFS 44.

2. Permanency Plan Procedures

- Work with DSCO to develop materials for court personnel and agency staff to further clarify definitions, requirements, and procedures for permanency hearings.
- This may include issuing joint memos, updating the judicial bench book, and training.

3. Permanency Plan Reviews

- Develop information materials for permanency plan reviewers.
- Training requirements for reviewers will be included in HFS 44.

4. Additional Policies

- Clarify what constitutes an exception to the reasonable efforts requirements and needed documentation.
- Clarify and communicate if agencies/courts may proceed to TPR if an adoptive resource has not been identified.

5. Foster and Adoptive Family Assessments

 Combine the foster and adoptive family assessments to streamline the home study process.

6. Family Connections

- Develop policy related to family interaction/visitation and include in HFS 44.
- Identification and notification procedures to assure compliance with ICWA.
- Develop policy and procedure related to locating, adjudicating, and involving noncustodial parents.
- Policy and procedure regarding searching for relatives and developing a safety assessment of a relative's home.
- Revision of the Ongoing Child Protective Services Standards and Practice Guidelines to include policy on face-to-face contact with parents, children, and foster parents.
