Re: DHFS Presentation to Guardianship and Custody Study Committee

Thanks for your recent letter, Russ. In response, I am providing you with the following materials in advance of our presentation on October 20, 2004:

- One page summary of subsidized guardianship program
- Excerpt from federal waiver terms and conditions
- Summary of subsidized guardianship program requirements
- 2003 Senate Bill 488

With regard to the attached Senate Bill 488, because the legislative session ended shortly after the bill was drafted we never requested some changes that we would like to see included in the bill. These are:

- At least a temporary continuation of any subsidized guardianship payment to a subsequent guardian in the event the current guardian dies or becomes incapacitated
- Allow full faith and credit for any tribal guardianship for purposes of the subsidy payment (since the guardianship would not have occurred pursuant to s. 48.977, Stats.)
- Allow a half-sibling of a child who is a relative of a Kinship Caregiver to be included
 in payments to the caregiver even if the child is not related to the caregiver (this is
 included because it may be a factor in reducing the number of subsidized
 guardianships)
