





WI Rail Tonnage (Thousands)



WI Air Tonnage (Thousands)







Airport Funding System Development


- State Airport System Plan identifies statewide needs
- Airports request projects
- Projects are prioritized
 - Type of work
 - Airport activity
 - SASP-identified needs
- 5-Year Airport Program published
- Program adjusted based on expected funds (fluctuating discretionary)

Airport Funding Project Development

- Continuous Bureau & Sponsor communication
- Airports submit their 5-year plans every 2 years
- Airport petitions DOT for project
- DOT evaluates eligibility of work
- DOT determines funding availability
- Project begins
 - Planning
 - Design
 - Construction




Freight rail at a glance... Wisconsin is home to:

- 12 privately-owned freight railroads
- Over 3,600 route miles of track
- Includes about 600 miles of state-owned track leased to railroads

About 6,000 rail-grade crossings



- Each year, these railroads move approximately 150 million tons of freight including:
 - •coal, grain, paper, ore, lumber and other freight.





Freight Rail Infrastructure Improvement Program (FRIIP)

 Loan program - as loans are repaid, the dollars are used to fund new projects

 Improvements to: rail infrastructure, rail crossings, and the construction of new rail-served facilities



Freight Rail Infrastructure Improvement Program (FRIIP)

 Applicants include private industries, railroads, and local governments.

Since the program began in 1993,
 WisDOT has provided 70 FRIIP loans totaling \$70 million.



Freight Rail Preservation Program

 Grant program - covers up to 80% of projects that preserve rail service or rehabilitate facilities on <u>publicly-owned</u> <u>rail lines</u>.

 Can be used to purchase abandoned lines in an effort to preserve future freight rail service.



Freight Rail Preservation Program

- Applicants include local governments and other public entities.
- Since 1980, under FRPP and related program, some \$80 million in grants awarded.

Amtrak "Hiawatha" service

- Seven daily trips between Milwaukee and Chicago
- Top-notch on-time performance
- Over 430,000 passengers last year and growing!
- Renovation of Milwaukee Amtrak station/stop at General Mitchell Airport

Amtrak "Empire Builder" service

- Recently celebrated 75-year anniversary traveling between Chicago and Seattle
- Each year, 75,000 travelers ride the train to and from stations in Milwaukee, Columbus, Portage, Wisconsin Dells, Tomah and La Crosse
- Supports many regional trips between Chicago and St. Paul.

- Agricultural products, coal, iron ore, wood pulp, cement, and salt.




